Of the Regular Meeting, of The Claiborne Parish Police Jury 10:00 a.m. January 13, 2021 Police Jury Chambers 507 West Main Street Homer, LA 71040

The second public hearing on the Proposed 2021 Budget was held at 9:00 am. There were no opposition letters received in person, via fax or email to the Claiborne Parish Police Jury.

The Claiborne Parish Police Jury met in regular session in the Jury Chambers of the Claiborne Parish Police Jury Complex, located at 507 West Main Street in Homer, LA at 10:00 a.m. on the 13th of January 2021. On being called to order by President Scott Davidson, the following Jurors were present:

James Laird, Mark Furlow, Kevin Gray, Mary McDaniel, Paul Cook, Tommy Sanders, Gill Dowies, and Rev. Willie Young, Sr.

District #7 Juror Joseph Merritt, Jr. was absent to help insure adequate social distancing with COVID-19 restrictions.

There were 11 others in attendance which included Secretary-Treasurer Dwayne R. Woodard, Parish Road Superintendent Tommy Durrett, Claiborne Parish Sheriff Sam Dowies, Claiborne Parish Sheriff's Chief Deputy Brian Driskill, Claiborne Parish Coroner Dr. Mark Haynes, Mr. John Monzingo of the Claiborne Parish 4-H, CMMC CEO Tina Haynes, Parish Engineer Randal Smoak of CGS Engineers, District 36 Senator Robert Mills, Mrs. Cathy Hightower of the Guardian Journal, and Mr. Jerry Whitton of Homer.

The meeting was opened with a word of Prayer led Rev. Willie Young, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance led by Paul Cook.

Upon motion by Mark Furlow, duly seconded by Paul Cook, the Jury unanimously voted to adopt the Regular Agenda as presented.

At this time, 2020 President Scott Davidson turned the meeting over to 2020 Vice-President Mark Furlow to start the process of electing the officers of the Police Jury for the 2021 year.

Vice-President Mark Furlow opened the floor for nominations for the 2021 President of the Police Jury.

District 8 Juror Tommy Sanders nominated District 6 Juror Scott Davidson for the position of President which was duly seconded by District 5 Juror Paul Cook.

Upton motion by District 8 Juror Tommy Sanders, duly seconded by District 4 Juror Mary McDaniel, the Jury unanimously approved that the floor be closed to nominations for 2021 President.

By acclamation, District 6 Juror Scott Davidson was elected as the 2021 President of the Claiborne Parish Police Jury.

At this time, 2020 Vice-President Mark Furlow turned the meeting back over to President Scott Davidson.

President Scott Davidson read aloud a notice that all Parish Employees are required to complete one hour of Ethics training by December 31, 2021.

President Scott Davidson requested that Senator Mills look into to finding an easier route for the rural parishes to sell adjudicated properties that the parishes inherit through non-payment of municipal taxes where they purchasers can be given clear title to these parcels and these properties can be placed back on the tax rolls. President Davidson reminded Senator Mills that the cost of all of legalese to obtain a clear title to the adjudicated property through a third party like Civic Source is extremely costly to the potential buyer compared to what the property is actually worth.

WHEREAS, many adjudicated properties are blighted and abandoned, and

WHEREAS, a sale program encourages redemptions and returns adjudicated properties to commerce, and

WHEREAS, title insurance provides investors the protection needed to redevelop adjudicated properties.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

Section 1. We hereby authorize the execution of a professional services agreement with CivicSource[®] to sell eligible adjudicated properties through online, market-driven public auctions and through an adjoining landowner program, and to perform all due diligence needed to both comply with applicable laws and to ensure purchasers the availability of title insurance.

Section 2. We hereby further authorize CivicSource[®] to execute any legally required documents necessary to transfer title and interest in and to adjudicated properties purchased at public auction or by adjoining landowners, as set forth above.

Public Comments:

Parish Coroner Mark Haynes also gave an update on the COVID-19 cases in the Parish. He stated that the numbers seem to have plateaued, hopefully. The last 2 weeks of December was brutal for COVID-19 due to the number of new cases in Claiborne Parish that required hospitalization. Medical professionals anticipate another spike in cases towards the middle to end of January due to Christmas and New Year's Holiday gatherings. Vaccines are starting to make their way into the Parish but right now they are in limited supply. Dr. Mark still stresses the importance for as many as possible to be vaccinated as soon as possible. He recommends to everyone that they call their local pharmacy and get on their list to have the vaccine shots as soon as they can.

CMMC CEO Tina Haynes gave her update for medical center. She stated that the last two weeks of December 2020 was terrible with the number of positive cases and sick people. There were no rooms available, so, they opened another wing to help house and treat the sicker COVID positive cases. Mrs. Haynes informed the Jury that she is always looking for help for our rural hospital, especially during these trying times. Our resources are limited, along with space to house the beds for patients. On the bright side Mrs. Haynes and her staff applied and received permission to implement the Hospital Without Walls Program for COVID patients that allows for those who qualify to be treated at home for COVID through home health. This is a huge asset for CMMC and our community allowing qualifying patients to be

treated at home, instead of at the hospital which frees u require more attention.	p beds and space for the sicker patients, that may
