CPPJ FY2020 CAPITAL OUTLAY AUTHORIZING RESOLUTION

Resolution No. <u>2019-019</u>

Resolution authorizing the filing of an application with the State of Louisiana Capital Outlay Program for a grant under to benefit Claiborne Parish Hospital Service District No. 3 (dba Claiborne Memorial Hospital) for the installation of a 400KW standby emergency power generator.

WHEREAS, the contract for financial assistance will impose certain obligations upon the applicant, including the provisions by it of the local share of project costs (to be provided by Claiborne Parish Hospital Service District No. 3);

WHEREAS, it is required by the State of Louisiana in accord with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, that in connection with the filing of an application for assistance that it will comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 requirements thereunder; and

WHEREAS, it is the goal of the Applicant that minority business enterprise be utilized to the fullest extent possible in connection with this project, and that definitive procedures shall be established and administered to ensure that minority businesses shall have the maximum feasible opportunity to compete for contracts when procuring construction contracts, supplies, equipment, or consultant and other services:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by Claiborne Parish Police Jury

- 1. That the Parish President is authorized to execute and file an application on behalf of Claiborne Parish Police Jury with the State of Louisiana, to aid in the financing of capital assistance projects under the Capital Outlay program.
- 2. That the Parish President is authorized to execute and file with such applications an assurance or any other document required by the State of Louisiana effectuating the purposes of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended.
- 3. That the Parish President is authorized to furnish such additional information as the State of Louisiana may require in connection with the application or the project.
- 4. That the Parish President is authorized to set and execute affirmative minority business policies in connection with the project's procurement needs.
- 5. That the Parish President is authorized to execute grant contract agreements on behalf of Claiborne Parish Police Jury with the State of Louisiana for aid in the financing of the operating or capital assistance projects.

6. This resolution is applicable for a period of one year unless revoked by the governing body and copy of such revocation shall be furnished to the State of LA.
