The Claiborne Parish Police Jury met in regular session in the Jury Chambers of the Claiborne Parish Police Jury Complex, located at 507 West Main Street in Homer, LA at 10:00 a.m. on the 7th of December 2022. On being called to order by Vice-President Mark Furlow, the following Jurors were present:

President Scott Davidson had to excuse himself just before the meeting due to illness.

Upon motion by Paul Cook, duly seconded by Gil Dowies, the Jury unanimously voted to amend the agenda and add the following items:

Vice-President Mark Furlow read aloud a Notice of Public Hearing on the Proposed 2023 Budget - All Funds to be held on Tuesday, January 3, 2023, at 2:00 pm and Wednesday, January 11, 2023 at 9:00 am in the Conference Room of the CPPJ Administration Bldg.

Upon motion by Kevin Gray, duly seconded by Mary McDaniel, the Jury unanimously voted to enter into an engagement agreement with Bosch & Statham, CPAs for the Audit of the Police Jury's 2022 Financial Statements and Agreed upon Procedures Report.

At this time, Melissa Bosch and Michael Statham presented the Police Jury's 2021 Audited Financial Statements and Agreed upon Procedures with no material findings.

Upon motion by Paul Cook, duly seconded by Rev. Willie Young, the Jury unanimously voted to enter into a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement between the CPPJ and La Department of Veterans Affairs for the location of the VA Office in the CPPJ Admin Bldg. (Monthly Support of \$1,191.00) The Claiborne Parish Office services over 800 Veteran's in Claiborne Parish with an estimated impact of \$4,612,000.

Upon motion by Tommy Sanders, duly seconded by James Laird, the Jury unanimously approved the request by Road Superintendent Tommy Durrett, to place a NO TRUCK Ordinance on Hebron Rd. and Friendship Rd. due to the bridge replacements on Hwy 9.

At this time Vice-President Furlow gave the Road Committee Report.

Upon motion by Kevin Gray, duly seconded by Paul Cook, the Jury unanimously approved the recommendation from the Road Committee, to surplus the 2013 Ford F750 Dump Truck

(approx. 126,000 miles) and the 120H Caterpillar Motor Grader. This equipment will be placed on GOVDEALS.com in January 2023 after the Jury decides on the minimum bids for each item.
